13 spay/neuter clinics were held, where **381 cats**, including **198 free roaming cats**, were spayed/neutered, avoiding hundreds, if not thousands, of unwanted kittens.

Since G.A.I.N.’s formation in 2014 a total of **5,018 cats and kittens** have been altered through these clinics.

17 dogs were altered through local veterinarians or low cost clinics through the Mike Harrison Memorial Fund.

266 cats and kittens were adopted into loving homes through G.A.I.N.’s foster program.

Since G.A.I.N.’s formation in 2014 a total of **2,173 cats and kittens** have been adopted through our foster program.

34 cats were placed through our Barn Cat working cat program.

37 pet owners were served through G.A.I.N.’s Companions program, which provided approximately \$10,000 of financial assistance for vet care to lower income pet owners.

183 pet owners were assisted through our pet food bank, ensuring **over 650 cats and dogs** did not go hungry.

Over half of those helped were **senior citizens** or **pet owners with disabilities**.
